In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)

An Act exempting the positions of police chief and fire chief in the city of Greenfield from the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The positions of police chief in the police department and fire chief in the  
2 fire department of the city known as the town of Greenfield shall be exempt from chapter 31 of  
3 the General Laws.

4 SECTION 2. This act shall not impair the civil service status of a person holding a  
5 position described in section 1 on the effective date of this act.

6 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
