An Act exempting the Deputy Police Chief of the town of Wrentham from the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the position of  
2 deputy police chief in the Town of Wrentham shall not be subject to chapter 31 of the General  
3 Laws and related regulations applicable thereto.

4           SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall not impair the civil service status of any person  
5 holding the position of deputy police chief in the Town of Wrentham on the effective date of this  
6 act.

7           SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
