**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**  
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An Act relative to collaborative drug therapy management optimization.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding section 24 B1/2 of chapter 112 of the General Laws or any other general  
2 or special laws to the contrary, collaborative drug therapy management may be allowed in  
3 ambulatory care clinics licensed pursuant to section 51 of chapter 111 of the General Laws if: (i)  
4 there is on-site or off-site supervision by the attending physician and a collaborating pharmacist;  
5 and (ii) collaborative drug therapy management is approved by the ambulatory care clinic's  
6 medical staff executive committee or designee or medical director or designee.
