Moore (by vote of the town) that the town of Shrewsbury be authorized to grant abatement of certain real estate taxes for the daughter of fallen firefighter Christopher Roy. Revenue. **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**

An Act authorizing the town of Shrewsbury to grant abatement of real estate taxes for the daughter of fallen firefighter Christopher Roy.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding Section 5 of Chapter 59 of the general laws or any general  
2 or special law to the contrary, the Board of Assessors of the Town of Shrewsbury shall grant  
3 abatement of the real estate taxes assessed for tax years 2024 through 2036, inclusive, upon real  
4 property that is (i) the domicile of Ava Roy, the surviving daughter of Christopher Roy, a  
5 firefighter killed in the line of duty; and (ii) owned by and occupied as the domicile of the  
6 guardian, trustee, conservator, adoptive parent or other fiduciary for Ava Roy.

7           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
