An Act requiring immunizations against preventable diseases.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 15 of chapter 76 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph and inserting in place  
3 thereof the following paragraph:-

4 No child shall, except as hereinafter provided, be admitted to school except upon  
5 presentation of a physician's certificate that the child has been successfully immunized against:  
6 (a) diphtheria, (b) pertussis, (c) tetanus, (d) measles, (e) poliomyelitis, (f) human papilloma virus,  
7 (g) hepatitis A, according to the schedule and dosage recommended by the centers for disease  
8 control, and (h) such other communicable diseases as may be specified from time to time by the  
9 department of public health.

10 SECTION 2. Said section 15 of said chapter 76, as so appearing, is hereby further  
11 amended by adding the following sentence: - The department of public health shall promulgate  
12 regulations to implement this section.
