An Act limiting time period parking lots can remain open.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, whenever the operation of a  
2 permanent entertainment venue with seating for thirty thousand or more persons is subcontracted  
3 for a single use event from an existing user or owner, the duration of operation of its parking  
4 areas shall be limited to a period of two hours prior to the start time of the event through two  
5 hours following the end of the event, excluding any educational venue or a venue that is  
6 subcontracted out for a high school, college or university event.
