**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act supporting access to training on reproductive and gender-affirming care.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 9A of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended, in line 8, by inserting after the word “assigned” the
3 following words:- . Exclusively for the purposes of learning reproductive or gender-affirming
4 care, a student of medicine who has creditably completed not less than two years of study in a
5 legally chartered medical school wherever located may practice medicine in a licensed health
6 care facility where reproductive or gender-affirming care may be lawfully provided and under
7 the supervision of a health care provider licensed in the commonwealth who, acting within the
8 scope of that license, may provide reproductive or gender-affirming care.
