An Act directing the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority to place naloxone at Red Line stations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Massachusetts Bay  
2   Transportation Authority shall create and administer an 18-month pilot program providing for  
3   placement of accessible naloxone at all Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority Red Line  
4   stations. Each of the stations shall have 3 freestanding unalarmed naloxone boxes. Each box shall  
5   contain 2 units of 4 milligram intranasal naloxone spray. The boxes shall be checked daily by  
6   Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority personnel to replace used naloxone and to create a  
7   record of naloxone used each day. Flyers shall be mounted around the naloxone box with  
8   information relating to naloxone training. Instructions on how to use naloxone in the event of an  
9   emergency shall be displayed near the boxes. The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority  
10   shall file a report on the efficacy of the pilot program with the clerks of the senate and house of  
11   representatives, the joint committee on mental health, substance use and recovery and the senate  
12   and house committees on ways and means. The report shall include an evaluation of the benefits

13 and costs of the pilot program, including, but not limited to, the record of naloxone used each  
14 day, and make recommendations on improving and expanding the pilot program throughout  
15 other transportation services in the commonwealth. The report shall be filed no sooner than 12  
16 months and no later than 18 months after enactment.
