In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to boat excise tax revenue for the Chatham waterfront.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding subsection (i) of section 2 of chapter 60B of the General
2	Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, 100 per cent of the sums collected by
3	the town of Chatham as excise tax on vessels pursuant to the provisions of chapter 60B shall be
4	credited to the town waterways improvement and maintenance fund established under the
5	provisions of section 5G of chapter 40.

6 SECTION 2: This act shall take effect upon its passage.
