An Act Authorizing the City of Newburyport to hold a special election for the purpose of accepting the terms of Clause 41C½ of Section 5 Chapter 59 of the Massachusetts General Laws.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to authorize the City of Newburyport to hold a special election, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the City of  
2 Newburyport, by majority vote of the city council, may call for and conduct a special election for  
3 the purpose of accepting the terms of Clause 41C½ within Section 5 of Chapter 59 of the  
4 Massachusetts General Laws.

5           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
