An Act relative to tax credits for homeless veteran housing.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any other general or special law to the contrary, the Commonwealth  
2 hereby directs the Department of Housing and Community Development to require that as part of  
3 the development of the Qualified Allocation Plan (QAP) for 2011, the Department must set-aside  
4 no less than 10% of its allocated tax credits for projects sponsored by nonprofits that will provide  
5 permanent housing for formerly homeless veterans in a service-based multifamily property and  
6 projects of no fewer than 20 units.
