Thursday, August 24, 2023.

Met at twelve minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Ms. Jehlen in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

Emergency Preamble Adopted.

An engrossed Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Jody Ricketson, an employee of the department of children and families (see Senate, No. 2433), having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage and containing an emergency preamble,-- was laid before the Senate; and, a separate vote being taken in accordance with the requirements of Article LXVII of the Amendments to the Constitution, the preamble was adopted in concurrence, by a vote of 2 to 0.

Jody Ricketson,--sick leave.

The bill was signed by the Acting President (Ms. Jehlen) and sent to the House for enactment.

Reports of Committees.

By Ms. Lovely, for the committees of Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of Paul R. Feeney and William Francis Galvin for legislation to protect seniors and adults with disabilities from financial exploitation.

By Ms. Lovely, for the committees of Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the Senate petition of John J. Cronin for legislation relative to modernizing Chapter 115.

Veterans benefits,-modernization. SD2587

The rules were suspended, on motion of Mr. Tarr, and the report was considered forthwith. Joint Rule 12 was suspended; and the petition (accompanied by bill) was referred to the committee on Veterans and Federal Affairs.

Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.
