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# JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Thursday, June 1, 2023.

Met at thirteen minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Brownsberger in the Chair) (having been appointed by the President, under authority conferred by Senate Rule 4, to perform the duties of the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Brownsberger), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

### Distinguished Guests.

There being no objection, the Chair (Mr. Brownsberger) handed the gavel to Mr. Timilty for the purpose of an introduction. Mr. Timilty then introduced, in the rear of the Chamber, the Archbishop Williams High School boys basketball team. They are the 2023 Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association Division 3 Boys Basketball Champions. The team was accompanied by the President of Archbishop Williams, Dennis Duggan, Athletic Director Sean McDonagh, Head Coach Brian Holden, Assistant Coach Pete Curley Team Trainor Stephanie Adukonis, School Administrator Stephanie Mariano, and Principal Michael Volonnino. The Senate applauded their accomplishments and they withdrew from the Chamber. They were also the guests of Senator O'Connor and Senator Keenan.

#### Matters Taken Out of the Orders of the Day.

There being no objection, the following matters were taken out of the Orders of the Day and considered as follows:

The Senate Bill establishing a sick leave bank for Amelia Alex, an employee of the department of children and families (Senate, No. 2383) (its title having been changed by the committee on Bills in the Third Reading),-- was read a third time and passed to be engrossed.

The House Bill to extend the time for the issuance of alcoholic beverage licenses in the city of Woburn (House, No. 316),-- was read a second time and ordered to a third reading.

Petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3888) of Kenneth I. Gordon that the Massachusetts Teachers' Retirement Board be directed to grant creditable service to Abby Levin for certain service rendered at the Northampton Center for Children and Families;

## Under suspension of Joint Rule 12, to the committee on Public Service.

The House Bill making appropriations for the fiscal year 2024 for the maintenance of the departments, boards, commissions, institutions, and certain activities of the Commonwealth, for interest, sinking fund, and serial bond requirements, and for certain permanent improvements (House, No. 3901),-- came from the House with the endorsement that the House had NON-concurred in the Senate amendment striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in Senate document numbered 2400, and had asked for a committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two branches; and that Representative Michlewitz of Boston, Ferrante of Gloucester and Smola of Warren have been appointed the committee on the part of the House.

On motion of Mr. Timilty, the Senate insisted on its amendment and concurred in the appointment of a committee of conference; and Senators Rodrigues, Friedman and O'Connor were appointed on the part of the Senate.

The bill was returned to the House endorsed accordingly.

#### Engrossed Bill.

An engrossed Bill authorizing the city of Somerville to continue the employment of Charles J. Femino as acting chief of police (see Senate, No. 2370) (which originated in the Senate) having been certified by the Senate Clerk to be rightly and truly prepared for final passage, was passed to be enacted and signed by the Acting President (Mr. Brownsberger) and laid before the Governor for her approbation.
