An Act amending the statute of limitations regarding criminal prosecutions for the crimes of sexual assault and rape of a child.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 277 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end
- 2 of section 63, as so appearing, the following paragraph: -
- Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, an indictment or complaint alleging
- 4 an offense of indecent assault and battery, or an offense of rape, may be found and filed at any
- 5 time after the commission of such offense, provided that the victim was under the age of 18
- 6 when the offense was committed.
