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An Act to eliminate the use of the MCAS for high school graduation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1D of chapter 69 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by  
2 adding after the word “graduation” in paragraph (i) the following words: —; provided however,  
3 that the MCAS test, so called, or other state-developed, standardized test, shall not be a  
4 component of the competency determination.
