## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act to restrict the use of polystyrene.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 An Act to Restrict the Use of Polystyrene
- 2 Chapter 111 of the general laws is hereby amended by inserting the following section 5T:

3 SECTION 1.

4 Definitions

- 5 "Disposable Food Container" means single-use disposable products used in the
- 6 restaurant, food service, and food sales industries for serving, transporting, or packaging
- 7 prepared, ready-to-consume, or uncooked food or beverages. This includes but is not limited to
- 8 plates, cups, bowls, trays, hinged or lidded containers, straws, cup lids, and utensils.

9 "Expanded Polystyrene" (EPS) means polystyrene that has been expanded or "blown"
10 using a gaseous blowing agent into a solid foam.

11	"Food Establishment" means an operation that stores, prepares, packages, serves, vends,
12	or otherwise provides food for human consumption, including but not limited to any
13	establishment requiring a permit to operate in accordance with the State Food Code.
14	"Polystyrene" means and includes expanded polystyrene which is a thermoplastic
15	petrochemical material utilizing a styrene monomer and processed by any number of techniques
16	including, but not limited to, fusion of polymer spheres (expandable bead polystyrene), injection
17	molding, form molding, and extrusion-blow molding (extruded foam polystyrene). The term
18	"polystyrene" also includes clear or solid polystyrene, which is known as "oriented polystyrene".
19	"Prepared Food" means any food or beverage prepared for consumption on the food
20	provider's premises, using any cooking or food preparation technique. This does not include any
21	raw uncooked meat, fish or eggs unless provided for consumption without further food
22	preparation.
23	"Retail Establishment" means any commercial business facility that sells goods directly

24 to the consumer including but not limited to grocery stores, pharmacies, liquor stores,

25 convenience stores, restaurants, retail stores and vendors selling clothing, food, and personal

26 items

27 SECTION 2.

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28	Except as provided herein, on or after August 1, 2018, food establishments shall be
29	prohibited from dispensing food to customers in disposable food service containers made from
30	expanded polystyrene.
31	SECTION 3.
32	Except as provided herein, on and after August 1, 2018, retail establishments shall be
33	prohibited from selling or distributing expanded polystyrene food service ware to customers.
34	SECTION 4.
35	The commissioner of public health shall promulgate regulations for the enforcement of
36	the foregoing section, which regulations shall provide for fines not to exceed one thousand
37	dollars for any single violation and for deferments, in accordance with the following:
38	A. Upon written application to the health department of the town or city in which it
39	operates, and upon showing by the food establishment that the conditions of this provision would
40	cause undue hardship, the municipal health department or its designee may defer application of
41	this provision for a food establishment for a one year period. An "undue hardship" shall mean a
42	situation unique to the food establishment where there are no reasonable alternatives to the use of
43	expanded polystyrene disposable food service containers and compliance with this provision
44	would cause significant economic hardship to that food establishment.
45	B. A food establishment granted a deferment must reapply prior to the end of that period
46	and demonstrate continued undue hardship, if it wishes to have the deferment extended.
47	Deferments may only be granted for intervals not to exceed one year.

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C. The application for a deferment or extension thereof shall include all information necessary for the municipal health department or its designee to make its decision, including but not limited to, documentation showing the factual support for the claimed deferment. The municipal health department or its designee may require the applicant to provide such additional information that it reasonably deems necessary to render a decision.

53 D. The municipal health department or its designee may approve the deferment 54 application, in whole or in part, with or without conditions.
