### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act protecting the interests of shareholders.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 93A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 11 the following section:-
- 3 Section 12. Any business entity carrying on trade in the commonwealth that issues stock
- 4 shall, within 30 days of receiving the written request of a holder of said stock residing in
- 5 Massachusetts, disclose the amount, nature, timing and purpose of any money or other property
- 6 of the corporation that was used in connection with an independent expenditure, contribution,
- 7 gift, transfer, disbursement, or promise of money or a thing of value to promote or assist in the
- 8 promotion of the success or defeat of a candidate, political party, or ballot question in any local,
- 9 statewide or federal election in Massachusetts.
- 10 Violations of this section are hereby declared to be deceptive acts or practices as defined
- by section 2 of this chapter and individuals or business entities affected by such conduct, as well
- 12 as the Attorney General, may seek the attendant remedies for such violations.
