**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**

An Act authorizing the town of Chesterfield to continue the employment of reserve special police officer Greg Smith.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Greg Smith, a  
2 member of the Chesterfield police department, may continue to serve as a reserve special police  
3 officer until he reaches 70 years of age or the date of his retirement or until his non-  
4 reappointment, whichever occurs first, and no further deduction shall be made from the regular  
5 compensation of Greg Smith in connection with his service to the town for retirement or pension  
6 purposes pursuant to chapter 32 of the General Laws for any service subsequent to Greg Smith  
7 reaching the age of 65.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
