The committee on Health Care Financing to whom were referred the petition of Richard T. Moore for legislation to establish the executive office of health and secretary of health (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 559), and the Bill relative to home care accountability (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 83), Bill establishing a reinsurance program to protect consumers of small group health insurance (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 495), Bill Relative to the Division of Medical Assistance (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 865), Bill Strengthening Health Reform (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 873), Bill providing for HIV testing for at risk police officers (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 954), Bill relative to the contraction of MRSA by public safety personnel. (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 1201), Bill ensuring continuity of care for patients taking prescription medicines (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 2099), Bill relative to oral cancer therapy (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 2271), Bill improving patient care procedures and reducing costs of long term care facilities (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 2299), Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission relative to reducing the wait time for medical equipment for children with special health care needs (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 2319), and Bill to improve the personal care attendant program (accompanied by bill Senate, No. 2230), reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5029) ought to be adopted.
