Jones, Jr., Viriato Manuel deMacedo and others for legislation to authorize organizations to employ certain persons to conduct raffles and bazaars, petition (accompanied by bill House, No. 274) of Michael J. Moran relative to the redemption of scratch tickets, petition (accompanied by bill House, No. 294) of Michael J. Rodrigues that the State Lottery Commission be authorized to enter into multijurisdictional games, petition (accompanied by bill House, No. 302) of Angelo M. Scaccia for legislation to provide for the distribution of lottery funds to cities and towns in direct proportion to the total revenues accruing from lottery sales in each such municipality, petition (accompanied by bill House, No. 322) of Steven M. Walsh, Denise Provost and others for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to the distribution formula of the State Lottery, and petition (accompanied by bill House, No. 3650) of Garrett J. Bradley relative to amending an appropriation for the state lottery, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5094) ought to be adopted.
