An Act relative to insurance surcharges.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, section 113B of chapter 175
2 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, and most recently amended by
3 chapter 155 of the Acts of 2009, is hereby amended by inserting in line 221, after the word
4 “incident.”, the following sentence:- “Driving a motor vehicle that has an expired inspection
5 sticker shall not be considered a surchargeable incident.”
