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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Eleven  
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An Act relative to the establishment of a minimum training wage.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 151, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is  
2 hereby amended by adding at the end of the first paragraph the following:

3           “This section shall not apply to workers under the age of eighteen during the first 90 days  
4 of employment. Said 90 day period shall be referred to as a training period. A wage of less than  
5 \$0.50 below the minimum wage, in any occupation, during a training period as defined in this  
6 chapter, shall conclusively be presumed to be oppressive and unreasonable, unless the  
7 commissioner has expressly approved or shall expressly approve the establishment and payment  
8 of a lesser wage under the provisions of sections seven and nine.”.
