By Mr. Jones of North Reading, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2360) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., and others relative to the use of Bisphenol-A in certain baby products. Public Health.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act Relative to Protecting Children from Bisphenol-A.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition,
2	is hereby amended by inserting after section 222 the following new section:-
3	Section 223. (a) As used in this section the following terms shall have the following
4	meanings:-
5	"Child care product", all pacifiers and reusable beverage containers intended for use by
6	children three years of age or younger for the consumption of food or liquids including, but not
7	limited to, the following: pacifiers, baby bottles, baby bottle liners, and cups, cup lids, straws,
8	and sippy cups.
9	"Commissioner", the commissioner of public health.

10 "Department", the department of public health.

11	"Infant formula", means a milk-based or soy-based powder, concentrated liquid, or
12	ready-to-feed substitute for human breast milk that is intended for infant consumption and that is
13	commercially available.
14	"Baby food", means a prepared solid food consisting of a soft paste or an easily chewed
15	food that is intended for consumption by children two years of age or younger and is
16	commercially available.
17	(b) Beginning January 1, 2012, no person or entity shall manufacture, sell, or distribute in
18	the Commonwealth of Massachusetts any child care product containing bisphenol A.
19	(c) Beginning January 1, 2012, no person or entity shall manufacture, sell, or distribute in
20	the Commonwealth of Massachusetts any infant formula or baby food stored in a plastic
21	container, jar, or can that contains bisphenol A.
22	(d) Manufacturers shall use the least toxic alternative when replacing bisphenol A in
23	accordance with this section.
24	(e) Manufacturers shall not replace bisphenol A, pursuant to this section, with
25	carcinogens rated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as A, B, or C carcinogens
26	or substances listed on the EPA's "List of Chemicals Evaluated for Carcinogenic Potential" as
27	known or likely carcinogens, known to be human carcinogens, likely to be human carcinogens,
28	or suggestive of being carcinogens.
29	(f) Manufacturers shall not replace bisphenol A, pursuant to this section, with
30	reproductive toxicants that the EPA has identified as causing birth defects, reproductive harm, or
31	developmental harm.

- 32 (g) The commissioner shall place bisphenol A on the lists of toxic substances, hazardous
 33 substances, and banned hazardous substances when bisphenol A is contained in child care
 34 products, or infant formula or baby food containers.
- (h)The department is authorized to promulgate such rules and regulations as it shall deem
 necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
