By Mr. Durant of Spencer, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3900) of Peter J. Durant and Richard T. Moore (by vote of the town) relative to amending the charter of the town of Southbridge. Municipalities and Regional Government. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act relative to the charter of the Town of Southbridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1-2-1 of the charter of the town of Southbridge, which is on file in
2 the office of the archivist of the commonwealth as provided in section 12 of chapter 43B of the
3 General Laws, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:- The town of Southbridge
4 shall be governed by those General Laws applicable to towns where the laws of the
5 commonwealth distinguish between towns and cities, and all laws applicable to towns shall be
6 applicable to the town of Southbridge, except as otherwise specifically provided in this charter;
7 provided, however, that section 32 of chapter 40 of the General Laws shall not apply to the town
8 of Southbridge.

9 SECTION 2. Section 2-2-2 of said charter is hereby amended by adding the following
10 sentence:-

11 No qualified voter of the town shall be eligible to run for the office of councilor if he or
12 she is not in good financial standing with the town by being current in all bills from the town.

13 SECTION 3. Said charter of the town of Southbridge is hereby further amended by
14 striking out section 2-4-4 and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

15 Section 2-4-4: The council may establish committees, subcommittees and advisory
16 committees as it deems reasonable and necessary and such committees may include non-
17 councilor members; councilor appointments to such committees shall be made by the council
18 chairperson; non-councilor member appointments to such committees shall be made by the
19 council subcommittee members subject to confirmation by the council.

20 SECTION 4. Section 9 of chapter 2 of said charter is hereby amended by adding the
21 following section:-

22 Section 2-9-5: The vice chairperson may be removed from said office by a two-thirds
23 vote of the entire council (i.e. a minimum of 6 votes). Any member of the council at any point
24 may make a motion to remove the vice-chairperson, and, if the motion is seconded, the motion
25 shall be voted upon at that time, without exception, by the council. A new vice-chairperson shall
26 be elected by a majority of the vote of the town council at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

27 SECTION 5. Section 1 of chapter 3 of said charter is hereby amended by adding the
28 following section:-

29 Section 3-1-5: Any elected or appointed member of a quasi-judicial board shall be
30 limited to 1 such board and ineligible to serve on any other such quasi-judicial board during their
31 term.

32 SECTION 6. Clause (a) of section 4-3-1 of said charter is hereby amended by striking
33 out the word “three” and inserting in place thereof the following figure:- 5 .

34 SECTION 7. Said section 4-3-1 of said charter is hereby further amended by inserting,
35 after the words “conservation commission” in clause (e), the following clause:-

36 ; (f) a 3-member liquor licensing board with 1 alternate member .

37 SECTION 8. Said charter is hereby further amended by striking out section 4-4-2.

38 SECTION 9. Said charter is hereby further amended by striking out section 4-6-1 and
39 inserting in place thereof the following section:-

40 Section 4-6-1: Final removal of the manager shall be effected by a two-thirds vote of the
41 entire council (i.e. a minimum of 6 votes) at an open council meeting.

42 SECTION 10. Said charter is hereby further amended by striking out section 9-1-2 and
43 inserting in place thereof the following section:-

44 Section 9-1-2: A person appointed to the liquor licensing board shall not be engaged,
45 directly or indirectly, in the commercial manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages, and if once
46 appointed a member engages in such commercial manufacture or sale, that member's office shall
47 immediately become vacant.

48 SECTION 11. The second sentence of section 11-4-3 of said charter is hereby amended
49 by striking out the words “twenty-five” and inserting in place thereof the following figure:- 15 .

50 SECTION 12. Notwithstanding section 42C of chapter 54 of the General Laws, this act
51 shall be submitted to the voters of the town of Southbridge in the form of the following 11
52 questions which shall be placed on the ballot at a regular or special town election to be held in
53 the year 2012 and the town council of the town of Southbridge shall cause a fair and concise
54 summary of each question to be included below each ballot question.

55 QUESTION 1: “Shall section 1 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
56 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

57 QUESTION 2: “Shall section 2 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
58 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

59 QUESTION 3: “Shall section 3 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
60 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

61 QUESTION 4: “Shall section 4 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
62 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

63 QUESTION 5: “Shall section 5 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
64 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

65 QUESTION 6: “Shall section 6 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
66 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

67 QUESTION 7: “Shall section 7 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
68 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

69 QUESTION 8: “Shall section 8 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
70 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

71 QUESTION 9: “Shall section 9 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
72 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

73 QUESTION 10: “Shall section 10 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
74 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

75 QUESTION 11: “Shall section 11 of an act passed by the General Court in the year 2012,
76 entitled ‘An Act Relative to the Charter of the Town of Southbridge’ be accepted?”

77 If a majority of the votes cast in answer to any of the questions is in the affirmative, the
78 town shall be taken to have authorized the amendments to the charter as set forth in those
79 sections of this act, but not otherwise.

80 SECTION 13. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
