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By Mr. O'Day of West Boylston, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of James J. O'Day for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Patricia Chasse, an employee of the Executive Office of Health and Human Services. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act Establishing a Sick Leave Bank for Patricia Chasse.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the executive office of health and human services, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the executive
2 office of health and human services shall establish a sick leave bank for Patricia Chasse, an
3 employee of the office. Any employee of the office may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick,
4 personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Patricia Chasse. Whenever Patricia
5 Chasse terminates employment with the office or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any
6 remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be transferred to the extended illness leave bank. Sick
7 leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability that
8 necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the office of health and
9 human services.
