**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

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**In the Year Two Thousand Eleven**  
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An Act regarding unemployment payments by cities and towns.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 151A of the General Laws shall be amended by adding at the end  
2 thereof the following section:

3           Section XXX. Notwithstanding any law, special law or regulation to the contrary, no  
4 state, county, or municipal governmental or school district acting as a subsidiary employee shall  
5 be liable for unemployment benefits regarding a sporadic employee when the sporadic employee  
6 is laid off by a different employer than the state, county or municipal subsidiary employer.
