An Act relative to motorist safety..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the general laws shall be amended by adding after section
2 14B, the following new section:

3 Section 14C. No motor vehicle with a roof area larger than ten square feet shall be
4 operated on the public roads with an accumulation of snow or ice on said roof if such
5 accumulation is one quarter of an inch thick or greater. It shall be the responsibility of the vehicle
6 owner as well as the operator to ensure the removal of accumulated snow and ice from a vehicle
7 before the vehicle is operated on any public way.

8 An operator of a non-commercial vehicle who violates any provision of this section shall
9 be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars for each offense which does not cause personal

10 injury or property damage and, five-hundred dollars for offenses resulting in personal injury or
11 property damage.

12 An operator of a commercial vehicle who violates any provision of this section shall be
13 punished by a fine of not less than one-hundred dollars for each offense which does not cause
14 personal injury or property damage and five-hundred dollars for offenses resulting in personal
15 injury or property damage.
