By Mr. Eldridge, petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1556) of Eldridge, Ross and Brownsberger for legislation to prevent undue influence on state hiring decisions [Joint Committee on Rules].

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act preventing undue influence on state hiring decisions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 3 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section
69 the following section:-

3 Section 70. No member of the general court shall, by any form of communication 4 including but not limited to phone calls, letters or electronic communication, recommend, 5 directly or indirectly, the employment or appointment of any person by any department of the 6 judicial or executive branch or any state agency or authority unless: (a) the member of the 7 general court has directly supervised said person in a professional environment for at least one 8 month; or (b) the member of the general court has had an ongoing direct professional 9 relationship with said person for a period of time no shorter than one year. Any member in 10 violation of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$100 per violation. 11 The payment of such fine may not be made by a political committee organized on behalf of a 12 member of the general court.
