In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to drivers license notifications.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The fourteenth paragraph of section 8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:-
3 The registrar shall place on any application for an original license or license renewal a section for
4 the applicant to voluntarily indicate an electronic mail or traditional mailing address. If the
5 applicant fills out said section, the register may send a required notice of expiration of license by
6 electronic mail or traditional mail to the applicant.
