An Act promoting the Commonwealth's economic recovery with a strong minimum wage.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 2	SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 151 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
3 4	Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in the second sentence, the words " $\$8.00$ per hour"
5	and inserting in place thereof the following words:-
6 7	\$11.00 per hour as of July 1, 2013, $$11.50$ per hour as of July 1, 2014 and $$12.00$ per hour as of
8	July 1, 2015
9 10	SECTION 2. Said section 1 of said chapter 151, as so appearing, is hereby amended by inserting
11	after the second sentence the following new sentences:-
12 13	Beginning in 2016, and in each year thereafter, the minimum wage shall be adjusted based upon the '
14	twelve-month percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for all Urban
15 16	Consumers (or a successor index, if any) as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the

17 18	United States Department of Labor, based on the most recent twelve-month period for which
19 20	data is available at the time that the adjustment is made, and rounded to the nearest five cents.
21 22	The adjusted minimum wage shall be calculated and announced by April 1 of each year, and
23	shall become effective as the new minimum wage on July 1 of each year.
24 25	SECTION 3. Said section 1 of said chapter 151, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by
26 27	striking out, in the last sentence, the figure "\$.10" and inserting in place thereof the following
28	figure:-

30 31	SECTION 4. Section 7 of said chapter 151, as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking out,
32 33	in the third paragraph, the words "the cash wage required to be paid such an employee on July 1,
34	1999" and inserting in place thereof:-
35	70 percent of the wage in effect under section 1 of this chapter
36	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on upon enactment.
