## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen  
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An Act relative to global positioning system technology and public employees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the  
2   Commonwealth and its political subdivisions may not employ the use of Global Position System  
3   technology, or other similar technology, to monitor or track employees of the Commonwealth or  
4   its political subdivisions, unless the implementation and terms of use of such technology is  
5   mutually agreed to in a collective bargaining agreement. In the absence of a collective  
6   bargaining agreement, the implementation and use of such technology shall be subject to the  
7   provisions M.G.L. chapter 7 sections 52-56.
