## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to student driver safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 8B of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3 The registrar shall provide the holder of a learner's permit with two removable, 4 transferable, highly visible, reflective decals indicating that the driver of the vehicle may be the 5 holder of a learner's permit. The decals shall be designed by the registrar. The registrar may 6 charge a fee for the decals not to exceed the actual cost of producing and distributing the decals. 7 The decals shall be displayed in a manner prescribed by the registrar, and shall be clearly visible 8 to law enforcement officers. The holder of a learner's permit shall not operate a vehicle unless 9 the decals are so displayed. Any individual found operating a motor vehicle in violation of this 10 paragraph shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50. The registrar is hereby authorized to promulgate regulations to assure the timely and effective implementation of this paragraph. 11
