An Act to promote and advance motorcycle safety..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 34 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by striking the paragraph located from line 85 through line 88 and adding in
3 place thereof the following: “Notwithstanding the first paragraph, of the total amount retained
4 each year into the Motorcycle Safety Fund, twenty percent (20%) shall be used to rebate, not less
5 than one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars of the cost of the Beginner Rider Course (BRC), as
6 designated by the Registrar, to those under twenty-one (21) years of age, who successfully
7 complete the course.”
