### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to prohibit the use of mobile telephones while operating a motor vehicle.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. Section 13B of Chapter 90 of the General Laws is amended by
 striking the section in its entirety and inserting the following new language:-

3 Section 13B. (a) No operator of a motor vehicle shall use a mobile electronic 4 device or a mobile telephone, unless said telephone is a hands-free mobile telephone. No 5 operator of a motor vehicle shall use a mobile telephone, mobile electronic device or other 6 device capable of accessing the internet to compose, send or read an electronic message while 7 operating such vehicle; provided, however, that this section shall not apply to the operator of a 8 public safety vehicle utilizing a mobile telephone, hands-free mobile telephone or other mobile 9 electronic device in the performance of his official duties. For the purposes of this section, an 10 operator shall not be considered to be operating a motor vehicle if the vehicle is stationary and 11 not located in a part of the roadway intended for travel.

(b) Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of \$100 for a first
offense, by a fine of \$250 for a second offense and by a fine of \$500 for a third or subsequent
offense. A violation of this section may be considered a moving violation for purposes of the
safe driver insurance plan under section 113B of chapter 175.

- 16 (c) It shall be an affirmative defense for an operator to produce documentary or
- 17 other evidence that the use of a mobile telephone or other mobile electronic device that is the
- 18 basis of the alleged violation was made for emergency purposes including, but not limited to, an
- 19 emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department or other
- 20 emergency services agency or entity.
