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By Mr. Pacheco, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2352) of Marc R. Pacheco and Susan Williams Gifford (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Wareham to grant additional liquor licenses. Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. [Local Approval Received.]

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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Fourteen  
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An Act authorizing the town of Wareham to grant additional liquor licenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the  
2           licensing authority of the town of Wareham may grant 4 additional licenses for the sale of all  
3           alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises, pursuant to section 12 of chapter 138, 1 to be  
4           granted to an establishment located at 35 Rosebrook place, 1 to be granted to an establishment at  
5           40 Rosebrook, 1 to be granted to the Lobster Pot located at 3155 Cranberry highway in the East  
6           Wareham section of the town of Wareham and 1 to be granted to a restaurant in suite 1 at the  
7           Tobey road and state highway route 28 plaza. The licenses shall be subject to all of said chapter  
8           138 except said section 17.

9           Once issued, the licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of that license to any  
10          other location, but it may grant a license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant  
11          files with the licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue and a letter from the  
12          department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those  
13          departments and that all applicable taxes have been paid.

14          If a license granted pursuant to this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use at the  
15          location of original issuance, the license shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights,  
16          privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority and the licensing  
17          authority may then grant the license to a new applicant at the same location under the same  
18          conditions as specified in this act.

19          SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
