An Act providing full student representation on the University of Massachusetts Board of Trustees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1A of Chapter 75 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the word “Nineteen” and inserting  
3   in place thereof the following word:- “Twenty-two.”

5           SECTION 2. The first paragraph of said section 1A of said Chapter 75, as so appearing,  
6   is hereby amended by striking out, in line 2, the word “Two” and inserting in place thereof the  
7   following word:- “Five.”

8           SECTION 3. The first paragraph of said section 1A of said Chapter 75, as so appearing,  
9   is hereby amended by striking out the last two sentences and inserting in place thereof the  
10   following sentence: - “The student members shall be elected annually by the student body of the  
11   Amherst, Boston, Dartmouth, Lowell, and Worcester campuses.”
