In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to protect temporary workers' unemployment benefits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 25(e) of chapter 151A, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is
- 2 hereby amended by striking out the eighth paragraph and inserting in place thereof the
- 3 following:-
- 4 "A temporary employee of a temporary help firm shall be deemed to have voluntarily
- 5 quit employment if (i) upon completion of an assignment, the temporary help firm contacts the
- 6 temporary employee in writing on a form approved by the director in which receipt is
- 7 acknowledged, notifying the temporary employee of an offer of reassignment of suitable
- 8 employment, that the temporary employee must reply to such offer, and that failure to respond
- 9 may result in ineligibility for benefits, and (ii) the temporary employee does not contact the
- temporary help firm inquiring for reassignment of suitable employment before filing for benefits.
- Failure to contact the temporary help firm shall not be deemed a voluntary quitting unless the
