An Act establishing a special commission on ovarian cancer.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

14	(1) establish a mechanism in order to ascertain the prevalence of Ovarian Cancer in

26	Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner
27	provided for the original appointments.
28	The commission shall organize within 120 days following the appointment of a majority
29	of its members and shall select a chairperson and vice-chairperson from among the members.
30	The chairperson shall appoint a secretary who need not be a member of the commission.

The public members shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided by section 2A of chapter 4 of the General Laws.

The commission shall be entitled to call to its assistance and avail itself of the services of the employees of any state, county or municipal department, board, bureau, commission or agency as it may require and as may be available to it for its purposes.

The executive office of health and human services shall provide staff support to the commission.

The commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the ouse of representatives on or before December 31, 2015.
