In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to certain taxpayer protections regarding casino gaming.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 16 of chapter 194 of the acts of 2011 is hereby amended in section	
2	55 of proposed chapter 23k, by adding the following subsection:- "(e) The commission shall n	
3	authorize a daily tax rate for any gaming license that is lower than the rates established in	
4	subsections (a) and (b) of this section as of the original effective date of this act."	
5	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no gaming	
6	licensee, affiliate, or close associate, or subsidiary of a gaming licensee, as defined by section 2	
7	of chapter 23K, shall be eligible for or receive a financial assistance using taxpayer dollars from	
8	the Commonwealth.
