**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to Lyme disease treatment coverage.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2 section 47DD, the following section:

3 Section 47EE.

4 (A) For the purposes of this Section, the terms “Lyme disease” and “long-term antibiotic
5 therapy” are given the same definition as provided in M.G.L. Chapter 112, Section
6 12DD.

7 (B) Any policy, contract, agreement, plan or certificate of insurance issued, delivered or
8 renewed within the commonwealth that provides medical expense coverage shall provide
9 coverage for long-term antibiotic therapy of Lyme disease when determined to be medically
10 necessary and ordered by a licensed physician after making a thorough evaluation of the patient’s
11 symptoms, diagnostic test results, or response to treatment. Long-term antibiotic therapy

12 otherwise eligible for benefits pursuant to this section shall not be denied solely because such
13 treatment may be characterized as unproven, experimental, or investigational in nature.

14 SECTION 2. Chapter 176A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
15 section 8FF the following section:-

16 Section 8GG. Any contract between a subscriber and the corporation under an individual
17 or group hospital service plan which is delivered, issued or renewed within the commonwealth
18 shall provide coverage for long-term antibiotic therapy of Lyme disease when determined to be
19 medically necessary and ordered by a licensed physician after making a thorough evaluation of
20 the patient's symptoms, diagnostic test results or response to treatment.

21 Treatment otherwise eligible for benefits pursuant to this section shall not be denied
22 solely because such treatment may be characterized as unproven, experimental, or investigational
23 in nature.

24 SECTION 4. Chapter 176B of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
25 section 4FF, the following section:-

26 Section 4GG. Any subscription certificate under an individual or group medical service
27 agreement delivered, issued, or renewed within the commonwealth shall provide coverage for

28 long-term antibiotic therapy of Lyme disease when determined to be medically necessary
29 and ordered by a licensed physician after making a thorough evaluation of the patient's
30 symptoms, diagnostic test results or response to treatment. Treatment otherwise eligible for
31 benefits pursuant to this section shall not be denied solely because such treatment may be
32 characterized as unproven, experimental, or investigational in nature.

33 SECTION 5. Chapter 176G of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
34 section 4X the following section:-

35 Section 4Y. Any individual or group health maintenance contract shall provide coverage
36 for long-term antibiotic therapy of Lyme disease when determined to be medically
37 necessary and ordered by a licensed physician after making a thorough evaluation of the patient's
38 symptoms, diagnostic test results or response to treatment. Treatment otherwise eligible for
39 benefits pursuant to this section shall not be denied solely because such treatment may be
40 characterized as unproven, experimental, or investigational in nature.
