**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to tobacco cessation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7 of chapter 270 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new paragraph:-

3 “The owner or other person in charge of a shop or other place used to sell any tobacco
4 products at retail shall conspicuously post signage provided by the Department of Public Health
5 that discloses current referral information about smoking cessation which may include but not be
6 limited to the website of the Massachusetts Tobacco Cessation & Prevention Program
7 (www.makesmokinghistory.org) and The Smokers Helpline at 1-800-Quit-Now (1-800-784-
8 8669).”
