An Act to protect consumers in the issuance of sports and entertainment tickets.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, an operator of a  
2 place of entertainment, or operator's agent, shall not employ a paperless ticketing system unless  
3 the consumer is offered an option at the time of initial sale to purchase the same tickets in some  
4 other form without additional fees.
