An Act prohibiting plastic carryout bags by 2019.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection shall promulgate regulations  
2 to prohibit the use of plastic carryout bags by the year 2019. For purposes of this section,  
3 “plastic carryout bag” means a plastic carryout bag provided by a store to a customer at the point  
4 of sale for the purpose of carrying purchased items from the store. “Plastic carryout bag” shall  
5 not include plastic bags in which loose produce is placed by the customer to deliver such items to  
6 the point of sale area of a store. This section shall not prohibit compostable plastic carryout  
7 bags, which conform to the current ASTM-Standard Specifications for compostability and is  
8 certified and labeled as meeting the ASTM-Standard by a recognized verification entity such as  
9 the Biodegradable Product Institute.

10           The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection shall promulgate regulations  
11 to enforce this section.
