An Act providing cardiopulmonary resuscitation training in high schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1L of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the second paragraph the following  
3 paragraph:-

4           All school committees and school districts shall provide for psychomotor skill-based  
5 cardiopulmonary resuscitation training and an overview of automated external defibrillator use  
6 for all high school students prior to graduation. This shall at a minimum include psychomotor  
7 skill, which means the use of hands-on practicing to support cognitive learning.

8           SECTION 2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall establish rules  
9 and regulations for monitoring adherence to section 1.
