**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to affordable and accessible high quality early education and care.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Commonwealth shall take
2 steps to assure (1) that all children in Massachusetts have access to affordable, high quality early
3 education and child care, including care during non-standard work hours; and (2) appropriate
4 professional development and compensation for early education and care providers.
