Adjourn In Memory of former Senator Arthur E. Chase

The Senators from Worcester, Ms. Chandler and Mr. Moore, and Senators Tarr, Hedlund, Ross, Humason, deMacedo and Fattman moved that when the Senate adjourns today, it do so in memory of former Senator Arthur E. Chase.

Arthur E. Chase, of Naples, Florida, formerly of Worcester, passed away on Monday, January 5, 2015 at the age of 84.

A former State Senator of the First Worcester District, Arthur E. Chase was dedicated to a career in public service. He formerly served in the United States Army, on the advisory board of Quinsigamond Community College, Worcester City Council as Councilor-At-Large, and the Worcester School Committee.

During his time in the Senate, he served on the following committees: Counties, Ways and Means, Health Care, Steering and Policy, Education, Arts and Humanities, Local Affairs, and Public Service Committees. He co-founded the Central Massachusetts Legislative Caucus, which includes many legislators today.

As a State Senator, Arthur E. Chase sponsored legislation creating the Massachusetts Academy of Math and Science at Worcester Polytechnic Institute, which continues to flourish and grow today as a long-lasting legacy.

He was also an accomplished businessman whose first company, Chase Paper Company, was chosen to print the official invitations for the 1981 inauguration of President Ronald Reagan.

He is survived by his wife of 12 years, Elaine (Rosenwasser) Chase; two sons, Micah Chase and his wife, Iris of Worcester, and Tzvi Ben Elya and his wife, P'nina of Yokneam, Israel; a daughter, April Chase-Lubitz and her husband Jeffrey of Providence, Rhode Island; two step-sons, David Kaufman and his wife, Aleda of Arlington, Virginia, and Aaron Kaufman and his wife, Stephanie of State College, Pennsylvania; and fourteen grandchildren.

He was predeceased by his first wife, Wynne (Laipson) Chase, who died in 1997. He was also predeceased by his brother, Lewis Y. Chase and his sister, Muriel Wilchins.

Accordingly, as a mark of respect in memory of Arthur E. Chase, at seventeen minutes before twelve o'clock noon, on motion of Mr. Rosenberg, the Senate adjourned to meet again on Monday next at eleven o'clock A.M.
