JOURNAL OF THE SENATE.

Wednesday, May 27, 2015.

Met at six minutes past eleven o'clock A.M. (Mr. Petrucci in the Chair).

The Chair (Mr. Petrucci), members, guests and staff then recited the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Petition.

Mr. Pacheco presented a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1926) of Marc R. Pacheco and Susan Williams Gifford (by vote of the town) for legislation relative to the position of constable in the town of Carver [Local approval received]; **Under Senate Rule 20, referred to the committee on Municipalities and Regional Government. Sent to the House for concurrence.**

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE

A Message from His Excellency the Governor (under the provisions of Article LXXXIV of the Amendments to the Constitution) recommending legislation relative to the 2015 annual town election in the town of Groveland (House, No. 3552),-- was referred, in concurrence, to the committee on Election Laws.

Recess.

There being no objection, at eleven minutes past eleven o'clock A.M., the Chair (Mr. Petrucci) declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair; and, at four minutes past two o'clock P.M., the Senate reassembled, Mr. Petrucci in the Chair.

PAPER FROM THE HOUSE

The House Bill making appropriations for the fiscal year 2016 for the maintenance of the departments, boards, commissions, institutions and certain activities of the Commonwealth, for interest, sinking fund and serial bond requirements and for certain permanent improvements (House, No. 3401, amended),— **came from the House with the endorsement that the House had NON-concurred in the Senate amendment (striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in Senate, No. 1930) and had asked for a committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two branches; and that Representatives Dempsey of Haverhill, Kulik of Worthington and Smola of Warren have been appointed the committee on the part of the House.**

On motion of Mr. Hedlund, the Senate insisted on its amendment and concurred in the appointment of a committee of conference; and Senators Spilka, DiDomenico and deMacedo were appointed on the part of the Senate. The bill was returned to the House endorsed accordingly.

Order Adopted.

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourns today, it adjourn to meet again tomorrow at eleven o'clock A.M., and that the Clerk be directed to dispense with the printing of a calendar.
