An Act Relative to Increasing the Penalties for Breaking and Entering Dwellings During the Daytime with Intent to Commit a Felony..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 17 of Chapter 266 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2000
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out same and inserting in place thereof the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) Whoever, in the night time, enters without breaking, or breaks and enters in the day
- 5 time, a building, ship, vessel, or vehicle, with intent to commit a felony, the owner or any other
- 6 person lawfully therein being put in fear, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison
- 7 for not more than ten years.
- 8 (b) Whoever, in the day time, breaks and enters a dwelling with intent to commit a felony,
- 9 the owner or any other person lawfully therein being put in fear, shall be punished by
- imprisonment in the state prison for life or any term of years, provided that any sentence
- imposed under the provisions of this paragraph shall be subject to the minimum requirements of
- 12 paragraph (c).
