Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 22 of Chapter 32A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the final paragraph and inserting in place thereof 3 the following paragraph:—For the purposes of this section, "licensed mental health professional" 4 shall mean a licensed physician who specializes in the practice of psychiatry, a licensed 5 psychologist, a licensed independent clinical social worker, a licensed mental health counselor, a 6 licensed nurse mental health clinical specialist, or a licensed rehabilitation counselor. 7 SECTION 2.
