An Act relative to reciprocity..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

| 1 | SECTION 1. Section 9 of Chapter 11c of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby |
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| 2 | amended by inserting at the end of the section the following:- |
| 3 | "(c) Emergency Medical Technicians who wish to become certified as an Emergency |
| 4 | Medical Technician in Massachusetts may apply to the department for certification by |
| 5 | reciprocity at the same level, without examination. Such application shall be in writing, be |
| 6 | accompanied by the certification fee, and contain the following information:1) Proof of current |
| 7 | licensure/certification as an Emergency Medical Technician by |
| 8 | a.) the state in which he/she currently functions and written verification from that state; or |
| 9 | b.) current registration with the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians and |
| 10 | written verification thereof. |
| 11 | 2) Proof of successful completion of an EMT-Paramedic training course that met the |
| 12 | minimum U.S. Department of Transportation's EMT Paramedic National Standard Curriculum. |
| 13 | 3) Current Basic Cardiac Life Support successful course completion credentials from the |

14 American Heart Association Health Care Provider or American Red Cross Professional Rescuer15 in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation.

| 16 | 4) Current Advanced Cardiac Life Support successful course completion credentials |
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| 17 | from the American Heart Association is required for reciprocity at the EMT-Paramedic level. |
| 18 | Individuals who meet the requirements for certification by reciprocity will be certified |
| 19 | consistent with the expiration date of their current certification but not to exceed a period of two |
| 20 | years. Following certification by reciprocity, the individual must comply with the requirements |
| 21 | of the department for recertification." |
